LAKES ART CENTER RECEIVES GRANT

The Lakes Art Center is pleased to announce it is the recipient of an Iowa Arts Council grant. The Lakes Art Center has been awarded \$4,150.00 for Midsize Operational Support. This grant was last received in 1996 by the Lakes Art Center. The grant application was submitted in March and in April Executive Director, Sue Carstens traveled to Des Moines for a review session.
 "I am very excited that the Lakes Art Center has received this funding," Carstens said. "Grants for operational support are getting harder to obtain, so this funding is especially important to our facility. I am happy the Iowa Arts Council liked our Center, its operations, goals and mission." Funding will be received after July 1.

LOCAL RESIDENTS AT LWML CONVENTION

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) of Iowa District West (IDW) held its 28th Biennial Convention June 25-27 at Camp Okoboji, Milford. A total of 274 delegates attended the convention. The theme for the gathering was "Walk in the Light." The LWML is an auxiliary of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod.
 At the convention, the delegates approved a goal of \$158,557.00 for mission projects. This money will be given during the next two years through Mite offerings. The projects include support for Iowa District West mission work, supporting Pass It On Mission efforts, LFS family counseling services, financial aid for students studying for full-time church work and purchasing equipment needed for the Library for the Blind.
 Leaders were inspired by speakers: Virginia Von Seggern, International LWML Vice President for Mission Education; Dr. Richard Kapfer, IDW President; Rev. Richard Latterner, Mission to American Indians and Gary Theis, Mission Development Counselor.
 Attending from St. John's Lutheran Church were Harriett Warnke, Dorothy Celak, Jeanne Olhausen and Norma Brinkert. The offering at the Communion service was in the amount of \$5,158.00. Of this \$2,579 was designated for the Orphan Grain Train and \$2,579 to Mission for American Indians.

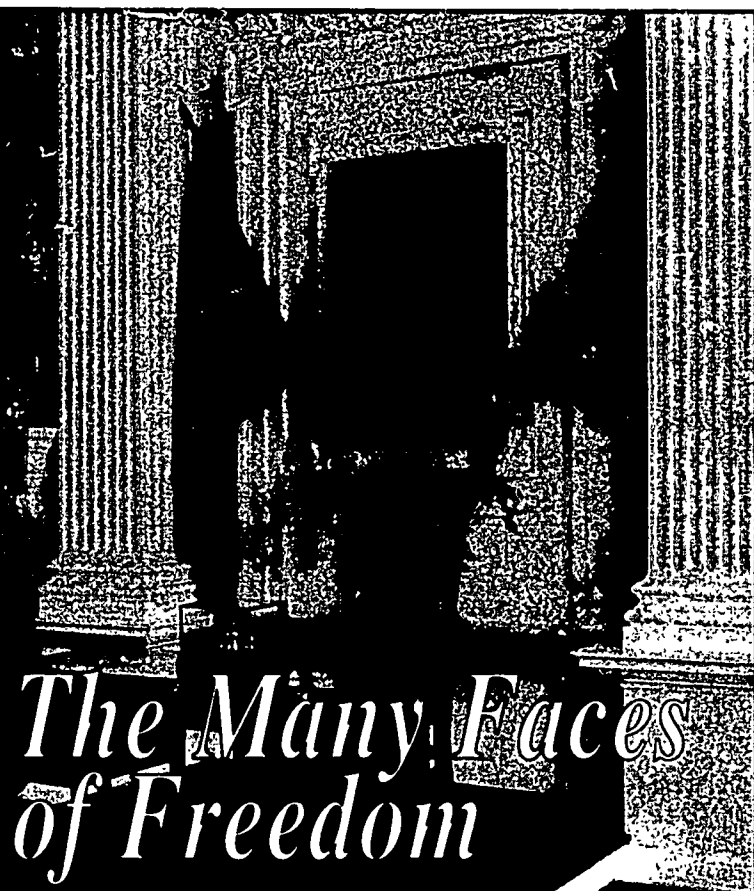
